HOW TO CELEBRATE
Nehemiah 7 - 8

1. REVIEW

What's the best celebration you've ever been a part of? What made it great?

Read Nehemiah 8:1-7. The wall is finished and the people are celebrating! How, specifically, do the people do that?

Why do you think it's so important to stop to celebrate what God has done?

2. ASSESS

How often do you reflect and celebrate God's action in your life?

One of the ways we celebrate is by elevating the Word of God. How would you describe the place the Word of God has in your life? Elevated or shelved?

Nehemiah celebrated by recognizing the people God used to do the work. Who has God used to do the work in your life?

3. APPLY

We just celebrated what God has done among us with our church family this weekend. Plan a specific time to celebrate what God has done with your own family before the end of the year.

Stop and praise God with your group right now. Take time to thank and praise him or all he has done and all he is going to do.
